Mouse monoclonal antibody prepared against the Langat virus (LGTV) envelope glycoprotein (E) was purified from clone 10F6 hybridoma supernatant by protein G affinity chromatography. The B cell hybridoma was generated by the fusion of Sp2/0-Ag14 mouse myeloma cells with splenocytes from mice inoculated with LGTV-infected mouse brain suspensions.¹

This reagent is part of the Joel M. Dalrymple – Clarence J. Peters USAMRIID Antibody Collection.

Material Provided:

Each vial of NR-40316 contains approximately 100 µL of purified monoclonal antibody in PBS. The concentration, expressed as milligrams per milliliter, is shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-40316 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic vials and is provided frozen on dry ice. The product should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Functional Activity:

NR-40316 is reactive in indirect immunofluorescence and western blot assays using LGTV-infected Vero cells. This antibody is also reported to function in ELISA, to specifically recognize LGTV E protein in immunoprecipitation assays, to have modest virus neutralization activity, and to cross-react on Hypr virus, Negishi virus, and Powassan virus.¹
